The Bush administration's controversial policies on detentions, interrogations and warrantless wiretapping were underpinned by legal memoranda. While some of those memos have been released (primarily as a result of <u>ACLU lawsuits</u>), the former administration <u>kept far more</u> memos secret than has been previously understood

. At least three dozen by our count.

The decision to release them <u>now lies with President Obama</u>. To help inform the debate—and inject an extra dose of accountability—we're posting the <u>first comprehensive list of the secret memos</u>

. (The ACLU first compiled a list, which ProPublica verified and expanded on.)

Note: Our list is quite inclusive, but we have chosen to leave off some documents, such as early drafts of later memos.
