The Close Guantanamo site received 154 photos of five former prisoners, and campaigners across the US and the UK for our poster marking 7,671 days of Guantanamo's existence on Jan. 11. Photos here and here.

On Jan. 11, I took part in an online panel discussion, hosted by New America, with Tom Wilner and Karen Greenberg. It's on YouTube here. And here's my article about it.

On Jan. 14, the UK Guantanamo Network held a march and rally in London, marching in orange jumpsuits and goods from the Houses of Parliament, up Whitehall, past 10 Downing Street, to Trafalgar Square, where we held a rally with speakers. Afterwards, five of us delivered a letter to the Prime Minister, Rishi Sunak, asking him to urge President Biden to take action to get Guantanamo closed, and also asking him to take in one or two of the men approved for release who can't be repatriated. My report and photos are here, and my article includes the text of a statement from former prisoner Omar Deghayes, which was read out at the rally.
